### **WINTER CARNIVAL**

### **PLACENTIA WELLNESS CENTRE**

The tender for the Owner Advisor for the Placentia Wellness Centre closed on January 5th. Screening of the submissions will be done by a selection committee comprised of staff from the Department of Municipal Affairs and the Town's Executive Committee. The owner advisor will prepare tenders to select a contractor for the design and construction of the facility is expected to start this summer.

### **UNITY PARC FITNESS ROOM - Find Your Fit**

There are several exercise machines now available in the upstairs fitness room (over the dressing rooms) at Unity PARC. Equipment includes: treadmill, elliptical, rowing machine, abs-machine, and a recumbent bike. There will be small dumbbells, resistance bands, an exercise (Swiss) ball and a workout bench added in the next week or so. New mats have been installed for floor work. The fitness room is open to adults only (18 years and older). Patrons are asked to bring along indoor footwear.





#### TRAFFIC CALMING

The following are traffic radar statistics collected throughout our Town. Motorists are reminded to slow down!

# Traffic statistics for Blockhouse Road (December 17th 2018 to January 13th 2019) are as follows:

- 62,964 motorists travelled west on Blockhouse Road (Average of 15,741/week)
- Average number of vehicles per day 2,249
- 28% of motorists exceeded the 50km speed limit
- Max speed clocked 114km/h

# Traffic statistics for Dunvile (Argentia Side) (December 17th 2018 to January 13th 2019) are as follows:

13,202 motorists travelled towards Dunville from Argentia (3,301/ week average)

- Average number of vehicles per day 472
- 82% of motorists exceeded the 50km speed limit
- Max speed clocked 111km/h

# Traffic statistics for Dunvile (Highway Side) (December 17th 2018 to January 13th 2019) are as follows:

- 26,454 motorists travelled towards Dunville from the highway (8,752/week average)
- Average number of vehicles per day 945
- 56% of motorists exceeded the 50km speed limit
- Max speed clocked 140km/h

# Traffic statistics for Jerseyside Hill (December 24th 2018 to January 13th 2019) are as follows:

- 35,009 motorists travelled up Jerseyside Hill (11,670/week average)
- Average number of vehicles per day 1,667
- 50% of motorists exceeded the 50km speed limit
- Max speed clocked 111km/h

### **WASTE COLLECTION**

In response to the number of complaints the Town has received about uncollected waste, the contractor has been directed to comply with the contract. Residents are also asked to make every effort to ensure their waste is accessible on the morning of collection.

# **ON-STREET PARKING BAN CONTINUES**

The Town reminds all residents, on-street parking is prohibited between the hours of 12:00AM and 10:00AM for the period of December 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31<sup>st</sup> in order to effectively carry out snow clearing activities. Also, for safety reasons, the dumping of snow from driveways onto public roadways will not be tolerated.

The Town has been authorized by the Provincial Government to issue summary offense tickets for such infractions. Please note damages to personal property (fences, garbage boxes etc.) due to the accumulation of snow are not the responsibility of the Town or contractor. Residents are asked to keep their garbage boxes free of snow to allow for safe waste collection.
