Frecker Place Agreement

Mayor Power informed Council that Mr. Maurice Griffiths visited the Town Office and signed the agreement for Frecker Place Development between the Town and Universal Construction.

RCMP Staffing

Sgt. Roger Flynn has been promoted and reassigned from the Placentia Detachment; the unit is down one other member as well. Super. Zettler informed the Mayor that when Sgt. Flynn ships out it will be approximately 90 day process to find his replacement.

LW Consulting Reports

Consultants conducting the review to create a terms of reference for a forensic audit and to perform a staffing and operations review for the Town presented draft documents on both projects at a meeting held September 10, 2015.

Councillors have been asked to provide feedback to the Executive Assistant by Friday, September 18, 2015 so that the consultants use the information to finalize their reports. A session to review the reports will be scheduled when those documents have been received and distributed to Council.

Capital Works Updates

There is a short delay in the anticipated completion date of the Freshwater Line Replacement project due to the amount of rock the contractor has encountered however the project will be finished in time to lay pavement this fall.

The tender for the replacement of the Freshwater and Jerseyside Reservoirs has been awarded and the contract was signed today.

Arena boards are in place; the work has progressed to the point that the arena will be ready for the PBIS Conference next week.

Hickey's Lane sewer replacement work has begun and is anticipated to finish on target.

Leave of Absence Request

Correspondence from Deputy Mayor Pearson requesting a leave of absence for the period from September 15 until October 23, 2015 for the purpose of work commitments was circulated prior to the meeting indicating that during this time period the Deputy Mayor will perform most but not all of his duties as outlined in the Municipalities Act.

Permit Not Recommended

The Public Works Committee did not recommend approval for crown land on Point Verde Road intended for storage and parking of heavy equipment - this is a residential area and there is concern with drainage onto Southeast Road and interference with existing waterway.

Council asked management to revisit this application due to consideration of approval in 2012. The file will be reviewed and referred back to the Public Works Committee.

MUNICIPAL & COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT

Jake Brake Use in Community

A resident requested that signage be erected on Route 100 asking heavy trucks to not use jake brakes when traveling through Dunville. The Town passed the request onto the Department of Transportation because this is a provincially owned road; they advised they will not put up any signs to this effect. The Town has no jurisdiction to do anything further in this regard.

Crosswalk Signage

The Public Works Supervisor advised he has gotten signs to indicate crosswalks on Prince William Drive and Blockhouse Road; they will be erected as soon as possible.

Littering

Town staff have been making another effort to clean up litter in the community (this is in addition to the recent cleanup earlier the summer). Residents will be encouraged through our social media to please not litter.

NTV Towers in Freshwater

The Municipal Enforcement Officer has left a message with Transport Canada regarding the lack of lights on the towers in Freshwater. He will follow up for a response.

CULTURE & TOURISM COMMITTEE REPORT

The report for the meeting held September 2, 2015 was circulated prior to the meeting. It was noted that the Voices of Placentia Bay Festival, Exhibit and Archaeology Interpretation Centre attendance was up considerably this year. Approximately 440 people visited the Interpretation Centre from the end of May to the end of August. The tentative date for next year's festival is August 5, 6 and 7, 2016.

Financial Approvals

The 2015 summer program has now ended on a successful note. The Recreation Director has submitted his report and his employment is terminated for this year.

PBIS - September 23, 2015

Council was reminded of the upcoming Placentia Bay Integrated Showcase starting September 23, 2015 and of the Premier's attendance.

Arena Canteen

An ad has been released searching for a tenant to lease the arena canteen this season.

Celebrity Hockey Game

Logistics of hosting a hockey game to be played by NHL Legends are being worked out. Discussions will be ensue for a game to be held on October 14, 2015.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

(Councillor Frankie Nash, Chair; Deputy Mayor Keith Pearson; Councillor Noella Collins; Resource Person - CAO)

There was a meeting with the Placentia Area Chamber of Commerce and plans were formulated to match town permits with the Chamber's membership footprint.

The Chamber noted that booth rentals at the PBIS are down this year but attendance is up.

The Chamber's annual general meeting is approaching - to be held around the 21st or 28th of October.

Council noted that it is good for local economic leaders ie the Chamber of Commerce, Argentia Management Authority, Placentia Area Development Association etc. to get together and collaborate on how to boost economic development in Placentia. Quarterly meetings to this end with open communication would be a definite asset.

CORRESPONDENCE

Correspondence for the month was circulated to Council and it was noted that there was an exchange of letters from Buckingham Palace regarding congratulations to the Queen on being the longest reigning monarch in British history.

COUNCILLORS' COMMENTS

Councillor Woodman would like to see properties properly identified; there is confusion with street numbers on Fox Harbour Road and a lot of lots remain unidentified throughout the Town.

Councillor Woodman advised there is a Placentia Bay Traffic Meeting in Arnold's Cove on September 17th but he will be unable to attend.

Councillor Woodman attended the UMC meeting in Carbonear this past weekend where discussions were held on regional service boards.

Councillor Nash noted loose manhole covers on municipal streets.

Councillor Nash commented that budget preparation time is fast approaching; the CAO advised that the Administrative Office Manager will be soliciting requests from department heads in the near future to begin the process.

Mayor Power asked that Councillors submit their comments on the LW meeting to the Executive Assistant by Friday.

Mayor Power advised of the *Take Back the Night* walk at 7:30 p.m. on Friday, September 18th. and of a session hosted by Kayla Pittman relating to victims of assault to take place on Friday afternoon and repeated Friday evening.
