COUNCIL MEETING WEBCAST

Council voted unanimously to webcast Council meetings using YouTube Live. Staff will rearrange the audio equipment in the Council Chambers to make it suitable for recording meetings. Residents will be notified on how to access the broadcast once equipment is in place.

Council proclaimed February 18-24, 2018 as Allied Youth Week in the Town of Placentia. Allied Youth is an organization for students grade 7 through 12 that encourages members to make choices that reflect a healthy lifestyle.

TRAFFIC CALMING

Council's Public Safety Committee provided the following stats collected on the Town's stationary traffic sign during the week of January 29 to February 25, 2018.

- 64,102 motorists travelled west on Blockhouse Road
- Average number of vehicles per day 2,288
- 28% of motorists exceeded the 50km speed limit
- Max speed clocked 97km/h

BACKFLOW PREVENTION

Did you know that a backflow valve can help prevent sewage in an overloaded main sewer line from backing up into your property? Placed directly in the sewer lateral coming from your property, the valve will automatically close in the event that there is a back up in the main sewer. Without this valve, your property is not protected. It is the property owner's responsibility to ensure that a backflow valve is installed.
