EXPENDITURE APPROVAL

Highlights of approved expenditures included:

• \$23,000 plus HST paving of Fort Louis Extension to English's Paving with a three year warranty

- \$6,000.00 plus HST for the purchase of a video borescope for camera exploration of underground infrastructure
- \$1,625.00 plus HST to complete line painting on Harbour Drive
- \$9,270.00 plus HST for repair of electrical service at the Jerseyside pump house
- \$3,000.00 annual grant to Placentia Historical Society following the review and acceptance of their 2017 financial statements
- \$103.50 to property owner for reimbursement of costs related to Public Works access to infrastructure to repair a leak on the property
- \$772.61 plus HST per month for 48 month lease to purchase five (5) Self Contained Breathing Apparatus
- \$2,000.00 HST included for the purchase of supplies for the Canada Day Celebrations
- \$2,300 plus HST for purchase of a gas powered tamper

TRAFFIC CALMING

As part of the Town's traffic calming initiative the following stats were collected during the period May 28 to June 24, 2018 east on Harbour Drive:

- 20639 motorists
- Average of 5160/week
- Average number of vehicles per day 737
- 91% of motorists exceeded the 50km speed limit
- Max speed clocked 100km/h

The following stats were collected west on Blockhouse Road:

- 72,189 motorists
- Average of 18047/week
- Average number of vehicles per day 2,578
- 28% of motorists exceeded the 50km speed limit
- Max speed clocked 106km/h

These stats are shared regularly with the RCMP. The Municipal Enforcement Officer was also asked to review regulations regarding the implementation of speed limits on municipal roads.

CULTURE AND TOURISM

The Town received an Award of Excellence from the Economic Developers Association of Newfoundland and Labrador for the "Basque in Placentia" Community Project. The Port of Argentia also received an award for Marketing. There were six provincial awards in total given out by the EDANL.
