The provincial government has announced temporary changes to the Atlantic Bubble travel protocol. Effective 12:01 am on Wednesday, November 25<sup>th</sup> people arriving in Newfoundland and Labrador from within the Atlantic Bubble will be required to self-isolate for 14 days upon arrival. Atlantic Bubble travelers will not have to apply for a travel exemption at this time. Rotational workers will now have to wait until day 7 to be tested rather than day 5. Updates on these temporary changes related to the Atlantic Bubble will be provided in two weeks. Non-essential travel outside of Newfoundland and Labrador is not recommended at this time. # **Highlights of the Public Works & Safety Committee Meeting:**

The RCMP report for October was circulated and reviewed by Committee. There were 52 files open within our Town and assisting other detachments.

In 2021, any new developments will require a permit approval regardless if it is a rebuild or new build. An information piece will be shared to residents in the newsletter in the New Year.

Anthracite and filter sand for the quality of Dunville water have been received and the Public Works staff has started the process of adding it to the Dunville water system. It will take some time for it to filter through the lines and make any difference to the colour of the water.

It was stated that there has been a 2-month delay with the government to get the tender released and approved for the Dunville water project. The town had all applications in by the September deadline and the project should have been started. The Department of Environment has some concerns with the connection of the ponds and piping that is being used. Council will contact Minister Bragg for clarification and will follow up with the Premier to see what the delay is on this approved project.

There were some concerns expressed by Councillors that Minister Bragg and the MHA were in the area and never gave any notification to the Town. The Mayor has asked the Minister to visit the area on several occasions concerning the flood zone issues around and Placentia Wellness Centre as well as other projects. Letters have been written to Minister and MHA to point out concerns.

### **CULTURE, TOURISM & BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE REPORT**

(Councillor Noella Collins, Chair; Councillor Kay Smith; Councillor Fitzpatrick; Resource Person - Manager of Tourism, Marketing and Communications)

The Culture, Tourism and Beautification Committee had no recommendations, however, provided the following updates:

The Arts Centre is open, rules are being followed and will not be changing until the Chief Medical Officers guidelines allow. Groups such as the Music and Friends group can use the Centre with a maximum of 20 people to ensure social distancing and masks must always be worn. Rules must be adhered to.

Unsightly properties are a continuous concern when promoting tourism in our area and are a deterrent to making our town a prominent tourist destination. Public Works have taken the initiative to get these properties cleaned up.

Legendary Coasts of Eastern Newfoundland and Hospitality NL both had their annual general meetings at which they elected their new board of directors.

Voices of Placentia Bay is hosting a Christmas Concert at the Star Hall on December 14<sup>th</sup>. 100 tickets will be sold for public attendance and the event will be videoed to share on social media for those that cannot attend.

A meeting is being scheduled with Sacred Heart Parish regarding the convent land.

The Town is planning on having fireworks on New Year's Eve. An update will be provided when the decision is finalized.

#### RECREATION COMMITTEE REPORT

(Deputy Mayor Keith Pearson, Chair; Councillor Lorraine Collins-Power and Councillor Jane Hynes; Resource Person – Manager of Recreation and Community programming)

Since the reopening of the Arena on October 15<sup>th</sup> guidelines and protocols around covid are being followed by staff and users and operations are running smoothly. Committee has adjusted the rule regarding spectators at practices and games to allow one adult per child of any age group to be allowed in the arena, providing the Declaration Form has been signed. Guidelines are in place for the protection and safety of users. Parent – Tot & Family skating have resumed as well as walking is now permitted from 12-3pm during weekdays. The provincial government has announced a Seniors Social Inclusion Initiative which the Placentia Area Seniors for Seniors group will be applying for. Funding will provide a one-time grant of up to \$2,000. The Manager has submitted the application.



There is great demand for the fitness room to reopen at the arena and the Manager is exploring options to make this possible. The room has poor air circulation, and 2 air exchange units will need to be installed to reopen the fitness room. Covid numbers are also being monitored. The purchase will be considered in the upcoming budget.

There were concerns reported regarding the doors being locked at the arena to control the amount of people in the building. Users were concerned that it was a safety hazard to emergency responses if there was an ammonia leak. The Manager had the Fire Chief inspect and it was determined that there is no safety concern to users.

# **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND COMMUNICATIONS**

There was some criticism from the Route 100 Committee and the Dunville Needs Clean Water Committee regarding communication with the Town. The Town has many avenues which information is relayed to residents and work actively to deliver all information on a timely manner. All issues pertaining to Route 100 and Dunville water issues have been delivered on social media and via a newsletter with up to date information of progress to upgrade and rectify the issues. Committee discussed that the Town has been diligent with communicating information to residents. An information piece with a current update on the Dunville Water Project was distributed through the mail to each resident of Dunville.

In lieu of public consultations, a newsletter will be released in the New Year for residents that will include a 2021 budget breakdown, a projection of plans the Town has for 2021 and a summary of 2020 highlights.

The Port of Argentia and the Town sponsored a food drive on November 29<sup>th</sup> in support of the Placentia Area Food Bank. This year, amid the covid-19 pandemic and its economic impacts, there are many families in need of food. Please donate non-perishable goods to the food bank supply.

#### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Next year, the Town is reviewing a business initiative of introducing a reward for businesses who stay in business over milestone periods, such as 5 years (bronze), 10 years (silver), and 25 years (gold).

The Newfoundland & Labrador Organization of Women Entrepreneurs (NLOWE) is the only provincial organization that is focused on women in business. They have programs and
