## **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

- Council welcomed Jonathan Galgay to the position of Chief Administrative Officer for the Town.
- Council extended congratulations to Fire Chief Wayne Power on his 50th membership anniversary in the Volunteer Fire Department.
- Council extended heartfelt condolences to the family, friends, and colleagues of former Mayor William P. Hogan on his recent passing. Out of respect for former Mayor Hogan and his immense contributions to the Town, the flags at the Town Hall were lowered to half-mast, and the Town offices will close on the day of his funeral.

### **EXPENDITURE HIGHLIGHTS**

Highlights of Council expenditures included:

- \$3,501.75 to 84641 NL Corp for emergency replacement of hot water tank at the arena.
- \$1,256.97 Camions Carl Thibault Inc. for auto pump A/C on Fire Engine #3.
- \$1,428.30 to Eastchem (NL) Ltd. for water treatment supplies.
- \$1,522.60 to Edison Security Services Inc. for replacement of security cameras at the arena.
- \$7,159.90 to Edward Collins Contracting for repairs to damage from Hurricane Larry in Jerseyside.
- \$17,069 for First Quarter Assessment Fess for 2022.
- \$9,940 plus HST to Mills and Wright Landscape Architecture for design, costing and drawings of outdoor stage design, lighting, accessibility, fencing, and 2 interpretive panel designs for the Town Square.
- \$1,378.85 to Edison Security Services Inc. for replacement of security cameras at the Town Hall.
- \$689,436.59 including HST to Locke's Electrical Ltd. for Blivet Retrofit & Upgrades project No: 17-GI-21-00093 (tender award)

### **PUBLIC WORKS MAINTENANCE**

Public Works Department was issued approximately 380 work orders in 2021. 325 work orders were successfully completed with 55 jobs remaining related to bridge repair, hydrant replacement, water leaks, signage, storm drainage, asphalt repairs, culverts, manholes, landscaping or other maintenance. Public Works is committed to addressing all issues in a comprehensive, timely, and cost effective manner.

Council emphasized the vital importance of the need for the Provincial Government to address the intermittent interruptions of the bridge operation and the necessity for the Town to be notified and updated on such occurrences. The CAO has reached out to the Department of Transportation as well as Communications and Public Engagement Division to address same.

## **CAPITAL WORKS UPDATE**

The Town has been awarded funding for a number of capital works projects scheduled to commence this spring/summer, namely:

Freshwater Outfall Upgrade \$430,000 Regatta Grounds Lift Station Upgrade \$211,000 Harbour Drive Storm Drainage System Upgrade \$736,00 Jerseyside Storm Water Collection Project -\$1,998,822 Southeast Blivet \$689,436.

The Town is awaiting decision on funding applications for Shoreline Protection for Harbour Drive & Fort Louis Boardwalk \$1.4 million and Town Square Revitalization \$290,000.

# **BUDGET 2022**

Council unanimously approved a balanced budget of \$6,546,170.84 presented by Finance Chair, Councillor Kay Smith. The budget allocated monies to allow for dedicated resources and funding to create, identify and spearhead new projects throughout the Town of Placentia. Council also reaffirmed its commitment to:

- Enhance the quality of life for its residents, businesses and visitors;
- Focus on delivering core municipal services;
- Provide a safe and healthy environment for citizens;
- Provide efficient and effective governance which is fiscally responsible;
- Create an atmosphere of openness and responsiveness to the needs of the community;
- Nurture and promote the Town's heritage and culture.
- Play a role in economic development.

### **BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS**

- No increase to mil rates
- No increase to water and sewer rates
- Two changes to fee structure for compliance letters and tax certificates
- Reintroduction of General Repair Permit \$25
- Change in discount period\*
- Commitment to clean drinking water and safe municipal infrastructure identified as top priority
